

Provo River Watershed Council Summer 2016 Tour

Provo River Watershed Council Members:

Please join us for our annual summer tour on Tuesday June 28th. Let's meet at Kamas City Building (170 N Main St, Kamas 84036) at 9:30am. Representatives from Provo River Water Users Association will guide us along several diversion structures and canals along the Provo River critical for conveying water for both culinary and irrigation purposes to downstream users. We will then head up the Provo River onto the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest where the Forest Service hydrologist will direct us towards popular recreating areas suffering from streambank erosion caused by flooding.

Lunch will be provided by Central Utah Wasatch Conservation District at Soapstone Campground. During lunch, Brigham Young University and iUtah representatives will talk about their current water quality monitoring and research specific to this stretch of river. There is no pavilion here so lunch will be "roughing it". We'll choose a spot along the river for lunch so please bring a camp-chair.

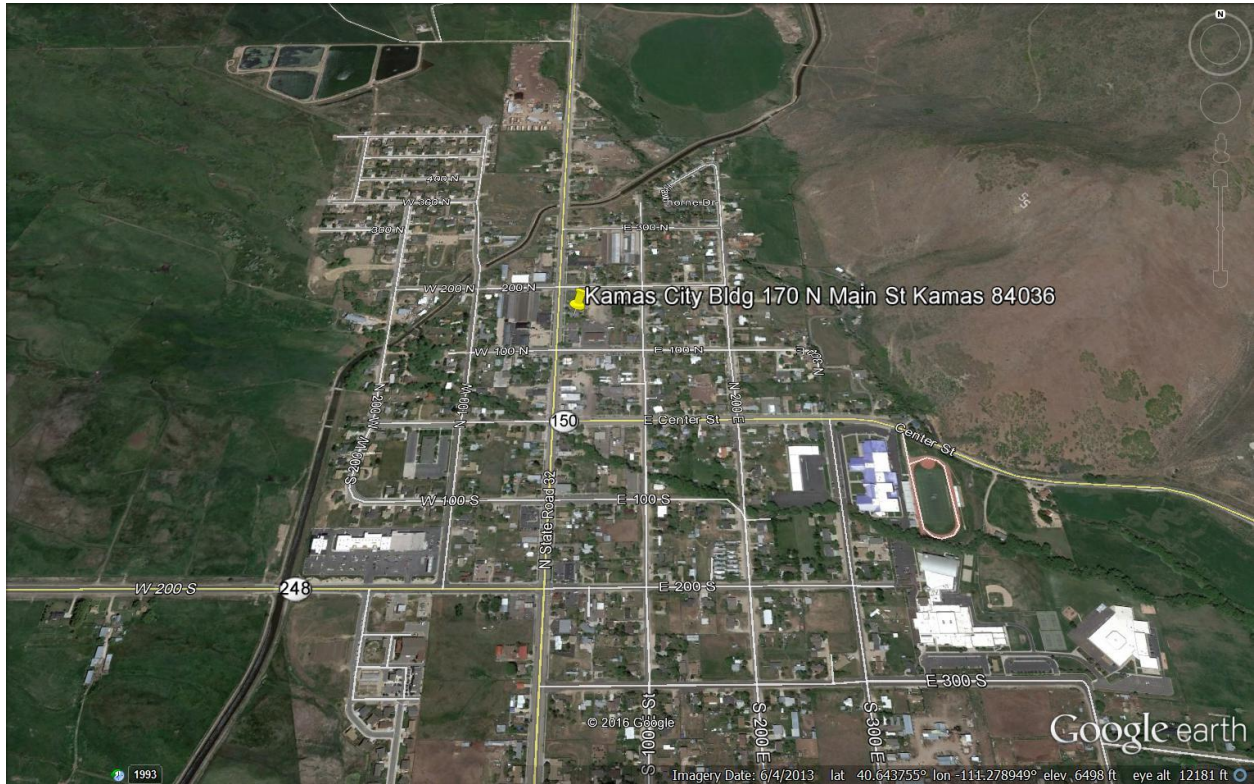
After lunch will continue upstream to the Duchesne River West Portal and a wetland complex created in the Provo River floodplain close to Murdock Basin Road. The tour should end no later than 2:30pm thus allowing folks to get back to SLC at a decent hour.
